The movie Harriet, chronicles Harriet Tubman's life from her escape from slavery through the dangerous missions she led to liberate hundreds of enslaved people through the Underground Railroad.

According to Chukundi Salisbury, Founder & Executive Director of 100 Black Parents, the idea behind the community screening is to give access to the film to families in the community who might not have the means to see it otherwise.

"We are hosting this screening to provide an opportunity for African American Families to have an intergenerational experience with others while building community.
